PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE

WALKING TOGETHER THROUGH THE MYSTERY OF HOLY WEEK

As a parish community, we are **invited to deepen our call** to walk together—not simply as individuals of faith, but as **collaborators in a common mission**. Each step we take, each act of service, and each prayer shared among us builds up something greater: a Church **renewed through unity**, strengthened by participation, and **shaped by the path we make together.**

Holy Week draws us more deeply into this shared journey. It is not merely a remembrance of what once happened, but a living mystery unfolding in our midst. As we follow Christ through these sacred days, we are called to serve with humility, to walk as one Body, and to protect the gift of communion. Where division threatens the unity of Christ's Body—whether visible or subtle—it must be faced and overcome. Only then can our witness be whole, and our mission reflect the One who goes before us.

In this **Great Week**—the **holiest of all weeks**—we follow the final steps of Christ. It begins on **Palm Sunday**, when palms wave and acclamations rise, but ends in the silent love of the pierced Body, lifted upon the wood of the Cross.

As the night of **Holy Thursday** unfolds, the hands that break the Bread serving the sacred communion are the same hands that wash the feet in humble compassion. The **Eucharist and service** reveal the heart of communion.

On **Good Friday**, the hands that healed wounds and fed the hungry with the Bread of life are now pierced and motionless, nailed to the Cross, redeeming the world without a word. In **silence**, **He gives everything**.

In the stillness of **Holy Saturday**, the Body once broken, buried, and wrapped in the silence of the tomb now rises in glory, and the Light shines forth, triumphant over death and darkness. The grave is no longer the end, but the **threshold of new life**.

SHARING THE WORD

Gospel Reading - Luke 22:14-23:56

The love and forgiveness which Jesus offered last week to the woman caught in adultery is now amplified and extended to include all humanity in the culmination of Jesus' life. Though innocent, Jesus finds himself in the shoes of the adulterous woman: he is charged, humiliated, and dragged before the public. Everything is upside-down: the one without sin continues to forgive: "for they know not what they do." The God who surprised us in Bethlehem again surprises us at the cross. Everything seems an utter failure, yet everything has been transformed forever.


- 1. Who are you in the story: one of the disciples, the Jewish authorities, the crowd, Peter, Judas, Pilate, Herod, or Jesus?







Red Dress Day Observance at St. Peter's



The disproportionate violence against Indigenous Women, Girls and Two-Spirit People has been called a national tragedy of epic proportion. Although Indigenous women and girls comprise less than 5% of the Canadian population, they represent nearly one quarter of all female homicides.

National Red Dress Day is on May 5, but we will bear witness to it on Sunday, May 4 at 1:00 pm after the 11:30 Mass. The Truth and Reconciliation Action Committee invites you to say the Rosary together in the Grotto as we remember and pray for these victims.

Advancing Truth and Reconciliation in our Parish



The St. Peter's Truth and Reconciliation Action Committee (TRAC) invites you to a five-part series of discussion and learning, using a Canadian film production entitled Bones of Crows. This builds upon on the sharing circles held last spring to better understand how the personal, community and social effects of the Indian Residential School System continue through today. Pope Francis urged us to take on this work during his pilgrimage to Canada and by the Truth and Reconciliation Commission's Call to Action #59.

Bones of Crows is a story of resilience and strength, grounded in historical truth. It weaves together underrepresented moments in Canadian and Indigenous history, including the Indigenous contributions to WWII, the ongoing cases of Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls and the Truth and Reconciliation Commission of Canada.

The episodes and the ensuing sharing circles will cover challenging material and so will not be suitable for children. The discussions after the viewing of the first two episodes were both thoughtful and sincere.

The third session will be on Saturday, April 26 in room C from 9:30 to 11:30 am. If you would like to review the first two episodes before attending, they are available at gem.cbc.ca/bones-of-crows.

MOTHERS' FELLOWSHIP


Come join other moms for an evening of prayer and fellowship.
