PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE

TOGETHER IN TRUST, GRATITUDE, AND GENEROSITY

The Church helps us understand the deeper purpose of the material resources entrusted to her care. As Canon Law teaches, temporal goods are meant to support the celebration of divine worship, provide for the support of the clergy and other ministers, and enable the works of the sacred apostolate and of charity, especially toward the needy (Canon 1254 §2).

The temporal goods of the Church, which sustain our parish life and allow our community to flourish, are not ends in themselves. They are practical means through which the Church's mission can take shape in the ordinary rhythms of parish life. Every contribution—whether for a ministry, the poor, or a building project—carries a purpose that the Church is called to respect with integrity and care.

At Saint Peter's, we are blessed with a variety of ministries that carry out our mission in different ways. Some are supported directly through the parish budget—they submit annual plans and are cared for as part of the parish's ongoing responsibility for its ministries. Others follow their own organizational rhythm and structure. Even if they are not directly funded by the parish, these ministries are still sustained through the generosity of our community.

In a parish enriched by numerous services and pastoral initiatives, it becomes essential to maintain a clear sense of priorities. We can't do everything at once. Together, we need to discern what should take precedence, what speaks most directly to our current reality, and how we can move forward with clarity and unity. This also calls for transparency and thoughtful care in how we manage what has been entrusted to us—ensuring that our decisions remain aligned with the mission we share. This is not about reducing what we do—it's about remaining faithful to the mission that guides us.

In keeping with our commitment to the careful stewardship of the resources entrusted to us, we have created two subcommittees within the Finance Council.

When there is trust, when people feel welcomed and know they have a place in the life of the parish, they are moved to contribute—quietly, freely, and in many different ways.

We are truly grateful for the many ways our parishioners support the life of our Church. Some offer regular contributions; others respond when a particular need arises. Many share their time and skills, while others support simply by being present—listening, encouraging, praying. Every gesture, no matter how visible or quiet, is part of something greater. It reflects a desire to belong, to serve, and to help the parish grow as a living community of faith. Through our initiatives, we are not just maintaining structures or raising funds—we are nurturing faith and building communion in a spirit of collaboration. And this, we can only do together.

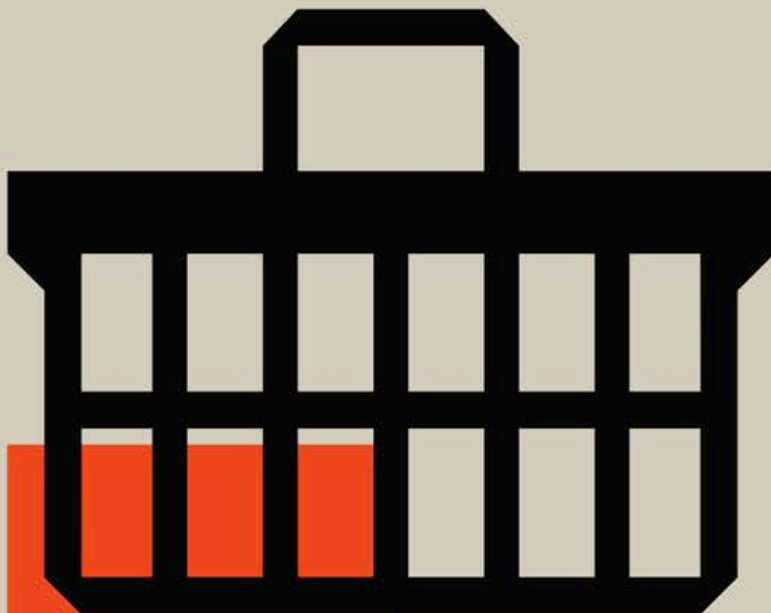

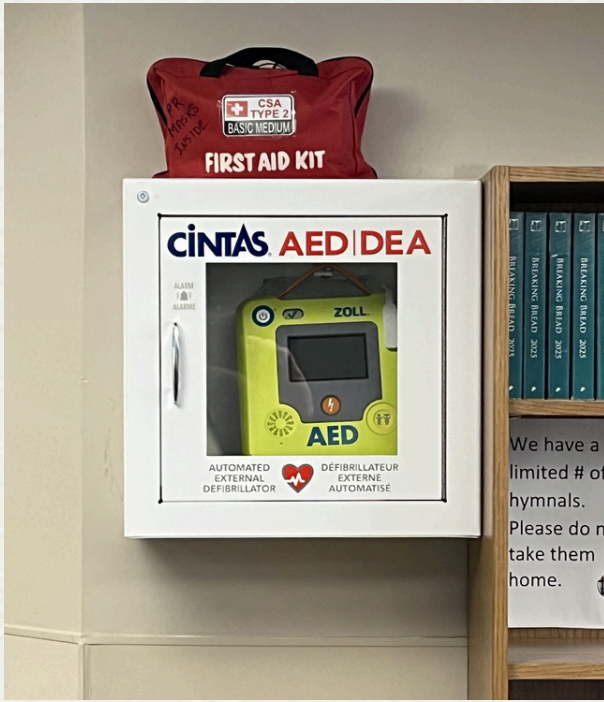

We have an AED!

It is located in a Cabinet in the Narthex next to the Bookshelf with the Hymn books. There is also a First Aid Kit with it. A dedicated team of parishioners, which includes professionals with experience in emergency response and healthcare, have chosen an audible, simple to use AED for adults/children. Ministry groups will be given an overview on it. A protocol has also been developed to ensure clear procedures are in place in the event of an emergency. This initiative reflects our ongoing concern for safety and preparedness within our parish community. We thank the donation that made this possible.

An AED (Automated External Defibrillator) is a portable, user-friendly medical device designed to analyze a person's heart rhythm and deliver an electric shock (defibrillation) if necessary to restore a normal heart rhythm in cases of sudden cardiac arrest

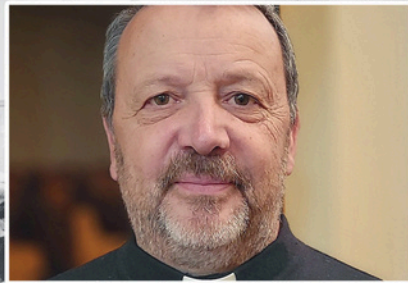

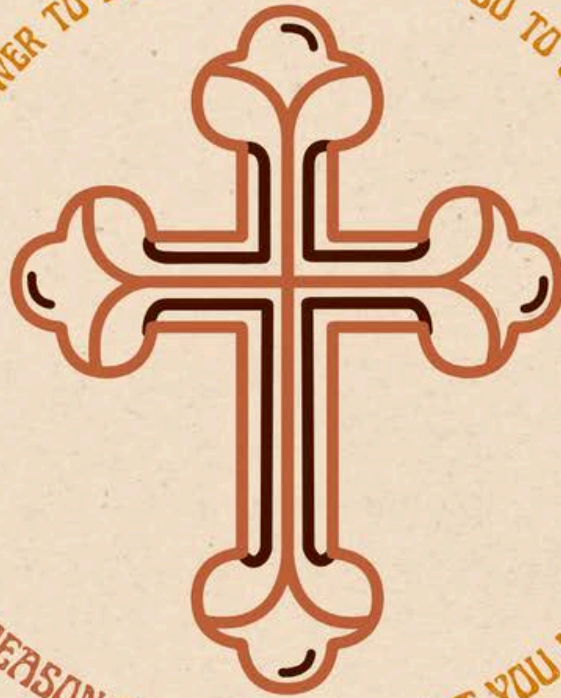
