APRIL 7, 2021 Wednesday of the Easter Octave Luke 24: 13-35

"DISCIPLES' BURNING HEARTS"

We have our own gloomy or sad days in our lives. Most of the time, problems, poor health, loss of jobs and loved one, financial downfall, heartaches, and even this pandemic put us in the lowest part of our lives. We are so depressed, seems alone in our fight, and hopeless. Now, new variants of virus are in our midst and this is more contagious. We are all concern with this new development and asking what is happening and when this thing will end? When we are confronted with this, to whom shall we go and to whom shall we hold on to?

This was also the question and sentiment of the two disciples of Jesus in the road to Emmaus. They were on the road to Emmaus to 'flee and forget' the painful experienced they had. But amidst this hopeless and tragic event of their lives, the Risen Lord joined in their journey.
