## "YOUR SINS ARE FORGIVEN."

Yesterday, we heard the expelling of demons from the two men and by expelling them, He also free them from their sins, from the power of Satan. In today's gospel, again the power of Jesus was clearly manifested. When the scribes questioned His authority, Jesus gave the best answer and shown them who the Son of Man is, the One who will liberate all from the bondage of evil and diseases: "For which is easier, to say, 'Your sins are forgiven,' or to say, `Rise and walk'? But that you may know that the Son of Man has authority on earth to forgive sins -- He then said to the paralytic – "Rise, take up your bed and go home.' And he rose and went home."<sup>1</sup>

The moment we approach Him, open arms He will embrace us, forgive us, and love us even more. "Jesus claimed an authority which only God could rightfully give.
