JUNE 12, 2021 Memorial of the Immaculate Heart of Mary Luke 2: 41-51

"MARY'S HEART IS FULL OF LOVE."

"In 1944, in the midst of World War II, Pope Pius XII dedicated the entire world to the patronage and protection of the Immaculate Heart of Mary—the intention expressed in his decree was "peace among nations, freedom for the Church, the conversion of sinners, the love of purity and the practice of virtue." Though it found prominence in the 20th century, devotion to Mary's Immaculate Heart is not new. Early Christians revered the movements of Mary's heart in the Gospels—she pondered the events of the nativity in her heart (Lk 2:19); and when she and Joseph presented Jesus in the temple, Simeon prophesied that a sword of sorrow would pierce her heart (Lk 2:35)."¹ And in our gospel today, "His mother treasured all these things in her heart."²

The feast of the Immaculate Heart of Mary is a manifestation of a mother's love to Jesus and all her children, those Jesus' loved. This feast day is intimately connected to the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart that we celebrated yesterday. This is not a coincidence or accident but they are correlated. The celebration of the Sacred Heart of Jesus is a celebration of His great love for us sinners, especially on the day that He gave up His life on the cross. His love is great that's why He gave His heart, His love, His life for us. Likewise, Mary loved her Son all her life even on the foot of the cross, painful it was, she gave all to Him and obeyed the Father by saying from the bottom of her heart: "Let it be done to me according to your words."³ Because Mary loved Jesus, she also loved all those whom Jesus loves. Her heart is so big enough to incorporate us in hers. That's why, she is with us in the journey of our faith, whether we are happy, in pain, sorrowful, or joyful.
