JUNE 19, 2020 Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus Matthew 11: 25-30

"JESUS, MEEK AND HUMBLE OF HEART"

According to Pope Francis: "Draw from the Heart of Jesus the spiritual food and drink for your life so that, nourished by Christ, you are new persons, transformed in depth by this divine love." Today we are celebrating the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, one of the most widely practiced and well-known devotions in the Church. Jesus Christ's physical heart was considered the representation of His infinite, holy and divine love for all humanity. As we deeply reflect on this important feast, we can say that this is a continuity of the feasts of Pentecost, Holy Trinity, the Body and Blood of Christ because all these feasts propose on the love of God, the unselfish giving of God to us throughout the history of salvation.

"It was not until 1670 that the idea of a formal Feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus was promoted publicly by St. Jean Eudes (1602-1680). Soon afterward, this gained great impetus through the visions granted to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque in the convent of Rue de Bac (Paris), whose intense devotion to the Heart of Jesus urged her to "diffuse the treasures of His goodness," convinced that He had chosen her especially for this work. In 1765, at the request of the Queen of France, the papacy allowed the Feast to the Sacred Heart to be celebrated in France. A century later, at the petition of the French bishops, Pope Pius IX extended the Feast to the universal Church, with an emphasis on the need for reparation for sins and abuses whether personal or social. Today, the devotion to the Sacred Heart is centered around the centrality of Divine love, encouraging all to trust in God's overflowing benevolence towards the world He has made."²

If you are here because of your devotion to the Sacred Heart, what are you afraid of? Are you trusting Him that everything will be fine? Hold on to Him and feel His love through His Sacred Heart and the rest will be great.

My brothers and sisters believe in the promises of the Sacred Heart of Jesus: 'I will give them all the graces necessary for their state of life. I will give peace in their families. I will console them in all their troubles.' The Lord loves us because He loves us, no if and but, no inhibitions and boundaries. If we are really devotees of the Sacred Heart and followers of Jesus, do what His Heart is telling us and let the His Heart be our guide in life: Love without boundaries, and embrace everything, joy, happiness, contentment even suffering, pain and difficulties. And at the end, your heart will be like His Heart. Most Sacred Heart of Jesus, have mercy on us. Amen.
