BE A GOOD AND FAITHFUL WITNESSES

Jesus chooses the apostles for what they can become. This is our reminder for today's celebration on the Feast of St. Andrew the Apostle. Jesus Christ chooses ordinary people to do great things for the Kingdom of God. Why He chooses them? My brothers and sisters, like St. Andrew and other Apostles and Saints, Jesus Christ also calls each of us to be His faithful apostles and messengers of the gospel. We are ordinary people but with a heart willing to listen to His instructions, open to what He wants us to do and humble even in failures and successes. He sees that to you, to us. He can use us for the greater glory of God. You can do great things for God because you are great in the first place, created in His image and likeness. We can be the hands, the feet, the eyes, the ears of God to others as we listen, embrace, love, care and welcome other people.

So. let us ask the intercession of St. Andrew that we may be a good and faithful witnesses of God's Kingdom to all we meet and share the joy of the gospel to others through our good example in words and in deeds.
